# **COMPETITION RULE BOOK**



## Acknowledgments

The Uhaina Life Guard Challenge is an international competition focusing on lifesaving rescue. It's a major exhibition bringing together sports events, demonstrations and animations.

The owner of the event, the Town Hall of Anglet, has entrusted the exclusive organisation to Les Guides de Bain Angloys lifesaving club, herein referred to as the "organisation" which is the sole responsible for resolving all disputes arising from this regulation.

## Section 1 - Eligibility

The teams will be composed of 6 rescuers (including 2 girls minimum) all aged at least 18 years old. They must have all practiced for at least one season as a professional rescuer within the city they represent (or the association that ensures its safety).

"Wild Card" derogations may be granted by the organisation at the reception of the applications.

## 26 French and International teams only will be selected for the first edition.

#### Section 3 - Composition of the pre-registration file

- Name of the city represented
- Contact details of the team captain for exchanges (e-mail, tel., address)
- Copy of each participant's passport
- Copy of their Lifeguard degree or certification
- Registration fees = 270 euros (180 euros for the events included 90€ for six Saturday lunches
- Possibility of registration for accompanying people = 15 euros for 1 meals Saturday lunches
- Registration fees will be paid by credit/debit card on the website

#### Section 4 – Ocean events

Specific to this competition and excluding IFL regulations

- Uhaina buoy
- Board rescue
- Swim relay
- Board relay
- Beach flag
- Bodysurf

#### Section 5 – Eligibility as a contestant team :

- Buoy, Board rescue, Swim relay, Board relay : 4 competitors including 1 girl at least
- Beach flag : 2 competitors including 1 girl
- Bodysurf : 4 competitors including 1 girl

#### Section 6 – Participation as a judge

- Each team must provide a judge for each event
- This clause is an obligation, on penalty of disqualification
- The distribution of these roles will be announced from registration
- The teams will be allowed to change the names of the judges to the organisation daily.

#### Section 7 – Counting of points

#### 7.1 For the Buoy, Swim relay, Board relay, Board rescue events

It will be a 12 team final

- 1<sup>st</sup> gets 20 points
- 2nd = 18 pts
- 3rd = 16 pts
- 4th = 14 pts
- 5th = 13 pts
- 6th = 12 pts
- 7th = 11 pts
- 8th = 10 pts
- 9th = 9 pts
- 10th = 8 pts
- 11th = 7 pts
- 12th = 6 pts
- Both 7th from the series = 5 pts
- Both 8th from the series = 4 pts,
- Both 9th = 3 pts
- Both 10th = 2pts
- Both 11th = 1 pt
- Both 12th and 13th = 0 point

#### 7.2 For the Beach flag events

The winning team is the one that gets the least points by adding the points of its 2 competitors (1 boy and 1 girl). There will be a girls' tournament and a boys' tournament.

#### Rankings for the event

- Eliminated in the first round (2 each heat) = 18 pts
- Eliminated in the second round (2 each heat) = 16pts
- Eliminated in the third round (2 each heat) = 14 pts
- Eliminated in the fourth round (2 each heat) = 12pts
- 10th = 10 pts

- 9th = 9 pts
- 8th = 8 pts
- 7th = 7 pts
- 6th = 6 pts
- 5th = 5 pts
- 4th = 4 pts
- 3rd = 3 pts
- 2nd = 2pts
- 1st = 1 pt

Example: A team with 1 girl who loses in the 3rd round of the heats = 14 pts, and a boy who finishes 5th in the final = 5 pts. Team total = 19 pts

Once the boys and girls points have been added, a ranking is made. The team with the fewest points wins the event.

- $2^{nd} = 18 \text{ pts}$
- 3rd = 16 pts
- 4th = 14 pts

- 6th = 12 pts

- 17th = 1 pt
- From  $18^{th}$  to 26th = 0 pt

## 7.3 For the bodysurf event :

Finalists

- 1<sup>st</sup> gets 20 points
- 2<sup>nd</sup> = 18 pts
- 3rd = 16 pts
- 4th = 14 pts
- The four 2<sup>nd</sup> teams in the second round = 10 pts
- The four 3rd teams in the second round = 8 pts
- The six 3rd teams in the first round = 4 pts
- The six 4th teams in the first round = 2 pts
- The six 5th teams in the first round = 1 pt

## Section 8 – Description of the events

## 8.1 Uhaina Buoy Race

- 2 podium places
- 4 lifeguards including 1 girl at least per team
- 1 Uhaina buoy provided by the organisation per team
- 2 heats of 13 teams, a 12 team final

Each victim swimmer must go to a specific buoy (if heaps of them) or to an area delimited by two buoys, without fins. He raises his arm as the sign of departure for the rescuer who can use bodysurf fins (fiber fins are not allowed). The latter is equipped with an Uhaina buoy which he strikes when he reaches the victim and puts it under his armpits to tow it on his way back. Assistants can only enter the water to help the rescuer from the moment he is on his way back. The victim can help the rescuer by kicking.

The arrival of a team is judged from the moment a part of the body of one of the assistants crosses the line provided that he is in contact with the victim and that the latter is also in contact with the second assistant. The victim is not allowed to help with his legs while he is dragged out on the sand.

## 8.2 Board Rescue Race

- 2 podium places
- 4 lifeguards including 1 girl at least per team
- 1 board rescue provided by the organisation per team
- 2 heats of 13 teams, a 12 team final

On the starting line, 1 Victim swimmer (NV1) must go to a specific buoy (if heaps of them) or to an area between two buoys, without fins. He raises his arm as a sign of departure for the board rescuer 1 (SP1) on his board rescue to round the buoy, loads the victim on his board and comes back with him. The two keeping contact with the board, come and slap the hand of the victim swimmer 2 (NV2) who does the same route as NV1. The Board rescuer 2 (SP2) does the same route as SP1. The arrival of a team is judged from the moment a part of the body of one of the two contestants number 2 crosses the line, provided that they are both in contact with the board.

## 8.3 Swim Relay

- 2 podium places
- 4 lifeguards including 1 girl at least per team
- 2 heats of 13 teams, a 12 team final

On the starting line, swimmer 1 (N1) must swim to a buoy (or two), go around it, come back, and slap the hand of swimmer 2 (N2), who is on the same route. And N3 and N4 do likewise. The finish is judged when N4 crosses the line on his feet.

#### 8.4 Board Relay Race

- 2 podium places
- 4 lifeguards including 1 girl at least per team
- 1 board rescue provided by the organisation per team
- 2 heats of 13 teams, a 12 team final

On a starting line, rescuer 1 rows to a buoy (or two) on his rescue board, rounds it, comes back, slaps the hand of rescuer 2 (S2) while carrying his board. S2 does the same route, then passes the relay to S3 which passes the relay to S4. The finish is judged when S4 crosses the line on his feet while carrying his board.

#### 8.5 Beach Flag

- 2 zones on 1 site
- 1 girl and 1 boy per team
- 2 series of 13 girls and 2 sets of 13 boys
- 2 eliminated per heat on the first 4 rounds and then 1 on each round.

From a prone starting position on the beach, the competitors rise, turn and race approximatively 20 meters to obtain a baton (Beach Flag) seated upright in the sand with 2/3 showing. Since there are always fewer batons than competitors, those who fail to catch a baton are eliminated. Competitors lie face down with their toes on the start line with heels or any part of the feet together, hands on top of each other with fingertips to wrists and with the head up. Elbows should be extended 90 degrees to the body's midline and hips and stomach must be in contact with the sand. The body's midline should be 90 degrees to the start line.

#### 8.6 Bodysurf

- 2 podiums
- 4 competitors including one girl.
- 1st round with 4 heats and 4 teams and 1 with 5 teams
- 2nd round with 4 heats and 3 teams
- A 4 team final

A Tag team of 40 minutes, unlimited number of waves, the best wave of each competitor is counted. All competitors must have taken at least one wave, otherwise the team will be ranked last in the heats.

#### Section 9 – Events schedule

Contestants must show up an hour before each event to the Beach Marshall.

The schedule may be changed at the last minute due to sea conditions and the weather forecast.
