Golden Rules of the ESPRIT D'AVENTURE 2023 Event



This event is organised by the Club Lotus France, is open to owners and enthusiasts of Lotus Esprit.

To participate in this event, each owner must have sent their registration form, be up to date with their payment, accept and sign the Golden Rules of the event and have received confirmation from the organiser.

Club Lotus France has the contract covering the civil liability of the event. Participants must be up to date with their car insurance and civil liability, and in possession of a valid driving license during the event.

The event takes the form of a tourist rally in Jura and Doubs area. It has no sporting character, just driving through scenic landscapes with no timings.

Three Golden Rules govern this event:-

- Safety & Security

Participants must respect the Highway Code and behave on the road giving priority to safety and sharing the public road. Participants are therefore asked to be particularly vigilant and cautious due the rural and touristic nature of the Department roads used, which may be narrow (passing car in slow motion) and/or cluttered with real obstacles (agricultural machinery, groups of cyclists, groups of children, harvest time, etc.). Be careful, these potential dangers on the road are not exceptions and can sometimes be unpredictable.

As with prudence and vigilance, participants are also asked to respect speed limits, ensure that they have a blood alcohol level below the legal limit as close as possible to zero (or even zero), remember to use the direction indicators, carry a warning triangle in the vehicle as well as Hi-Viz safety vests and, finally, in order not to interfere with the flow of traffic, to drive in groups of less than 5 cars where possible.

Any participant who does not respect the Highway Code and basic safety rules will be asked to leave the event without any possibility of compensation.

Usability

This event is a gathering of enthusiasts of the automotive world and more particularly that of the LOTUS ESPRIT. Whether during hotel stays, breaks, visits, lunches and of course on the road, goodnatured conviviality must be recognised, internally and externally, so that cordial communication allows exchanges of experience, advice, and mutual assistance as well as pleasant interactions with the inhabitants of the regions crossed.

- Routes and road book

The routes are planned so that everyone has a pleasant time, both of driving and discovery, whilst respecting the Highway Code. The road maps that include the routes are those of Jura and Doubs, for example the Departmental map N° 321 or regional map N° 520 from Michelin.

Even though the map of the recommended roads is sent to each participant in the days preceding the event, it is recommended that participants equip themselves with a road map (Michelin or otherwise). The map provided can be loaded on a tablet or a mobile phone, and edited. There is the option of whether or not to follow the daily planned routes but in any case, everyone should arrive at the specified meeting points at the time shown in the scheduled visits and meals information.

These meeting places are indicated on the road map provided. They are simple enough to find and easy to access, so that each participant can independently reach them without difficulty, making it unnecessary to drive in a convoy.
