In this analysis, we delve into the responses provided by championship shooters regarding the gear and equipment they used in the competition.

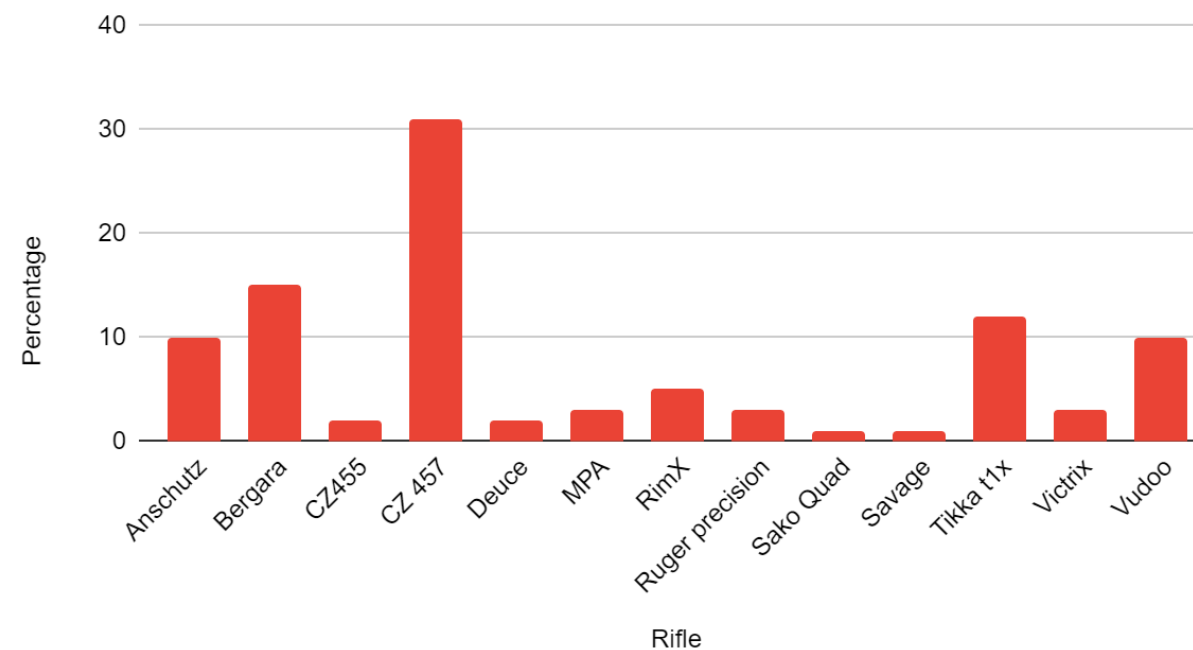

As per the diagram, we can see that the most popular rifle was CZ 457.

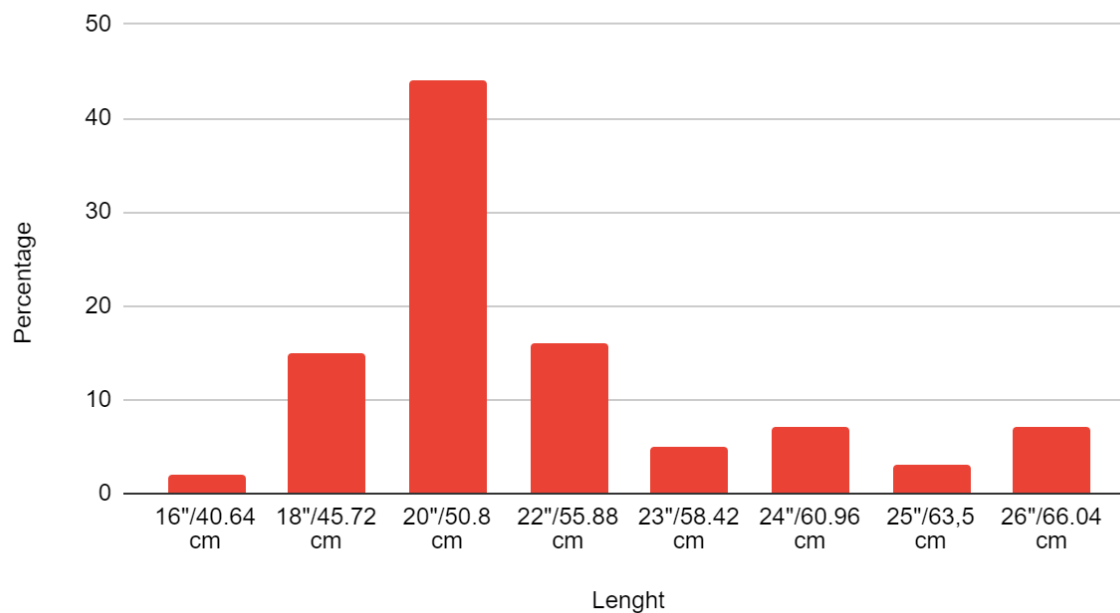


What rifle/action did you use?

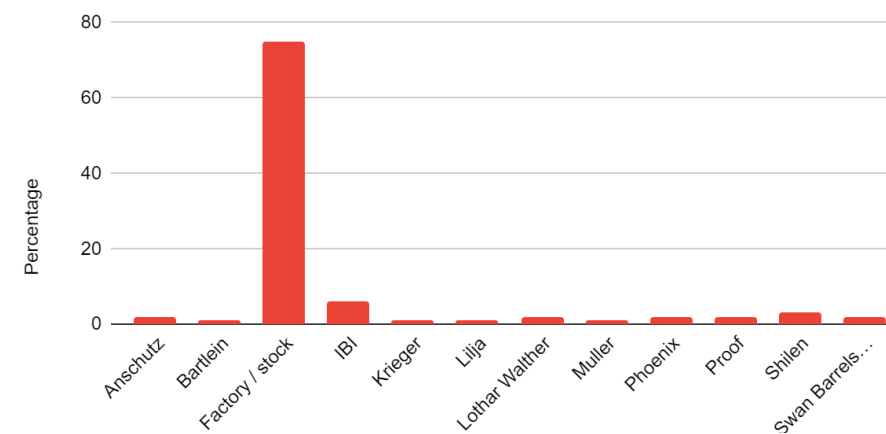


The most popular barrel length was 20 inches (50.8 cm), and the factory barrel was predominantly used, with IBI barrels coming in second place. Interestingly, the results indicate that the majority of shooters opted not to use a muzzle device. However, among those who did choose to equip one, tuners were the preferred type.

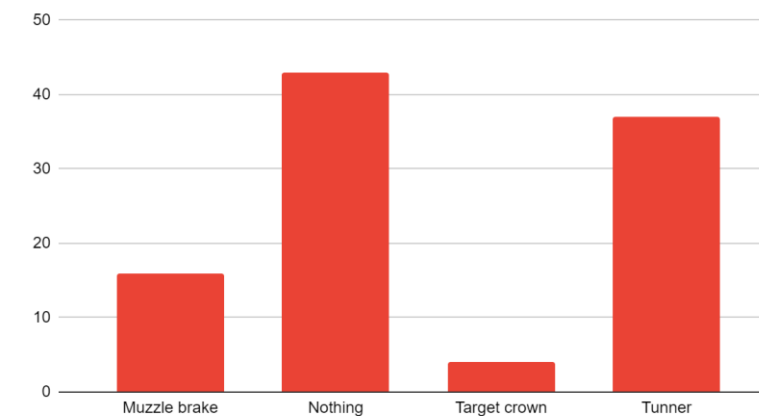
Barrel length



What barrel did you use?



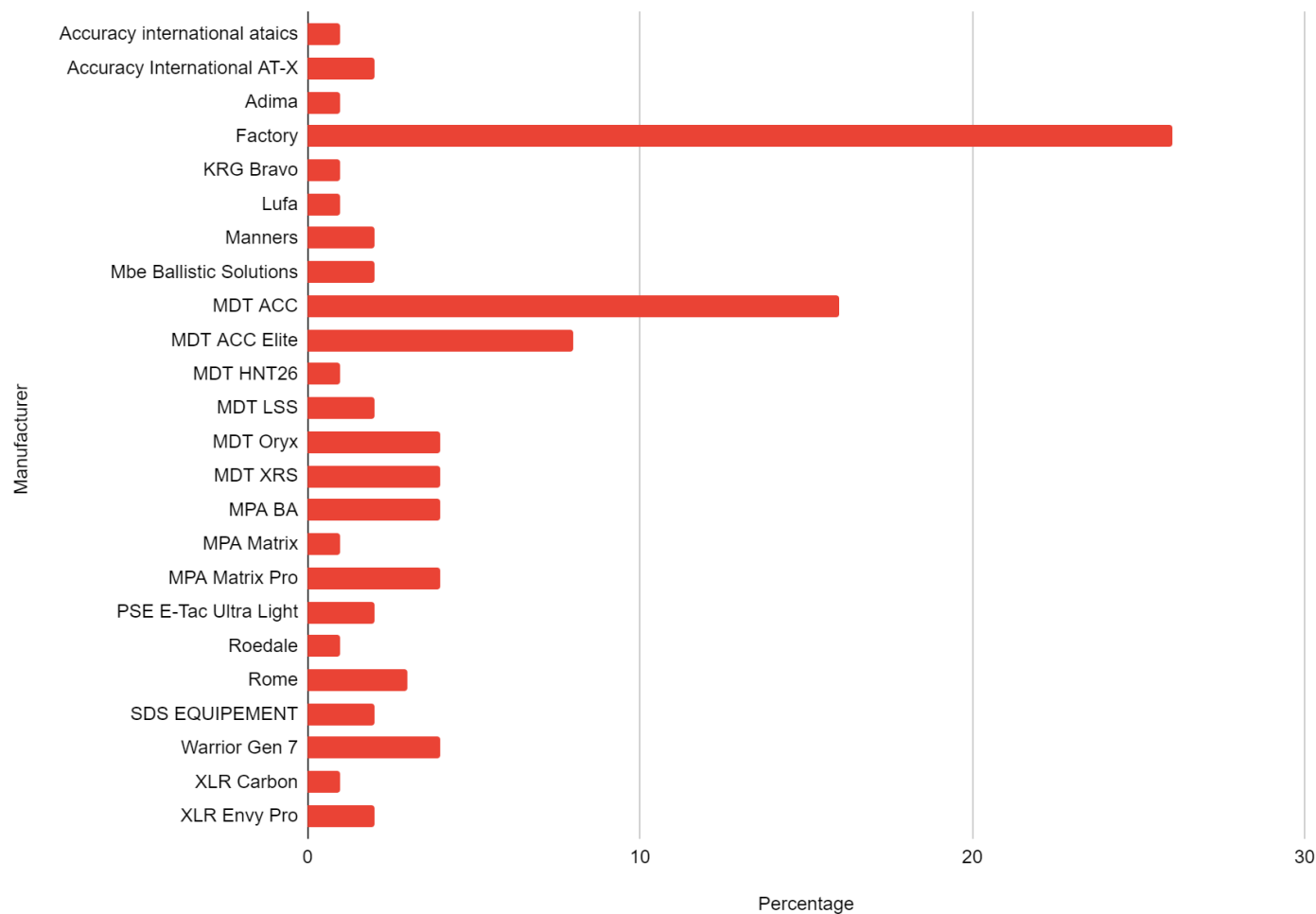
What muzzle device did you use?





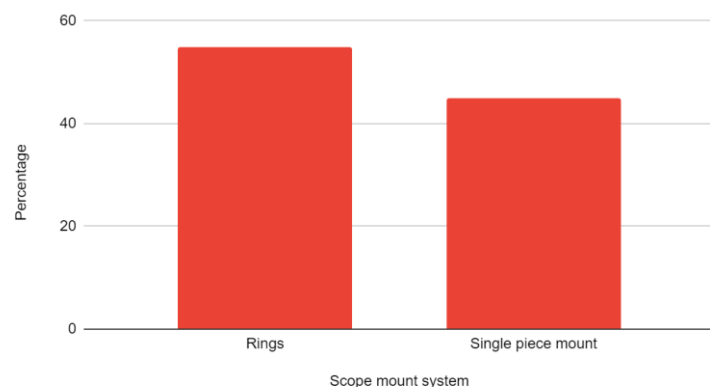
The selection of rifle chassis was extensive, providing a wide range of options. Among these choices, several chassis designs emerged as the most popular among competitors. Nonetheless, stock factory stocks remained the prevailing choice for most shooters.

What chassis/stock did you use?

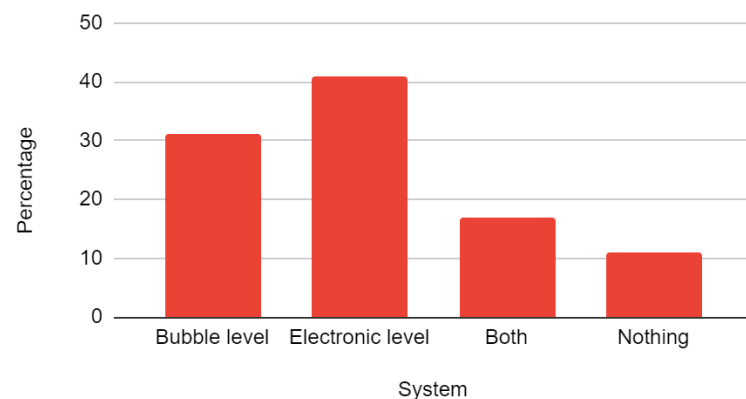


The choice between a scope mount and scope rings was nearly evenly split, with scope rings being slightly more favored as the mounting option. However, it's worth noting that the majority of shooters opted for a 20 MOA total scope cant in their setup. Additionally, it's noteworthy that nearly all shooters incorporated some form of leveling system into their setups, with electronic leveling systems being the top choice.

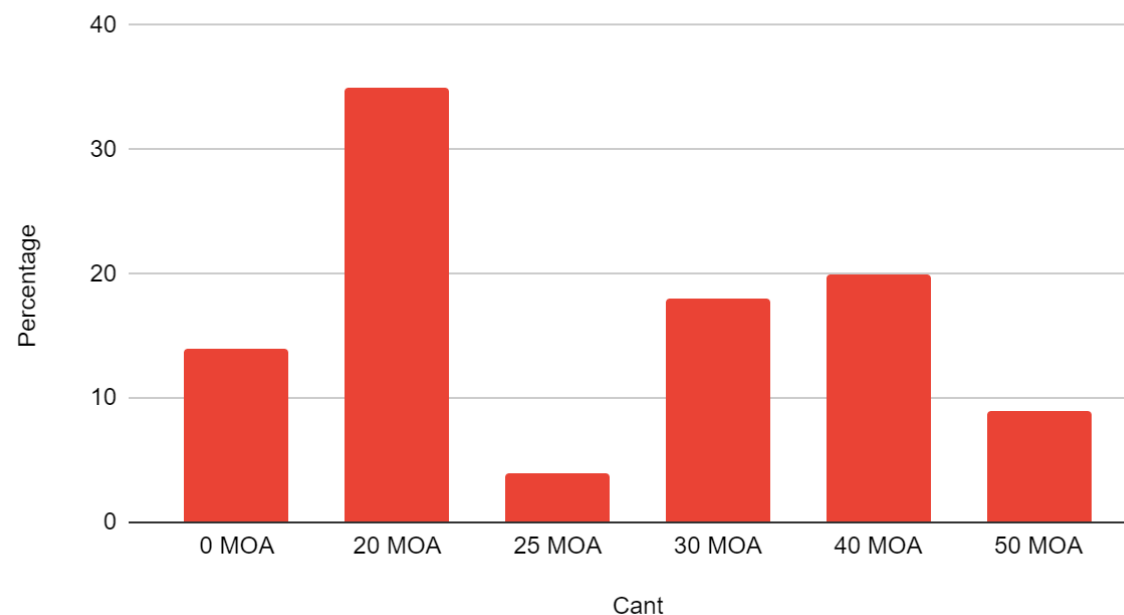
What type of scope mounting did you use?



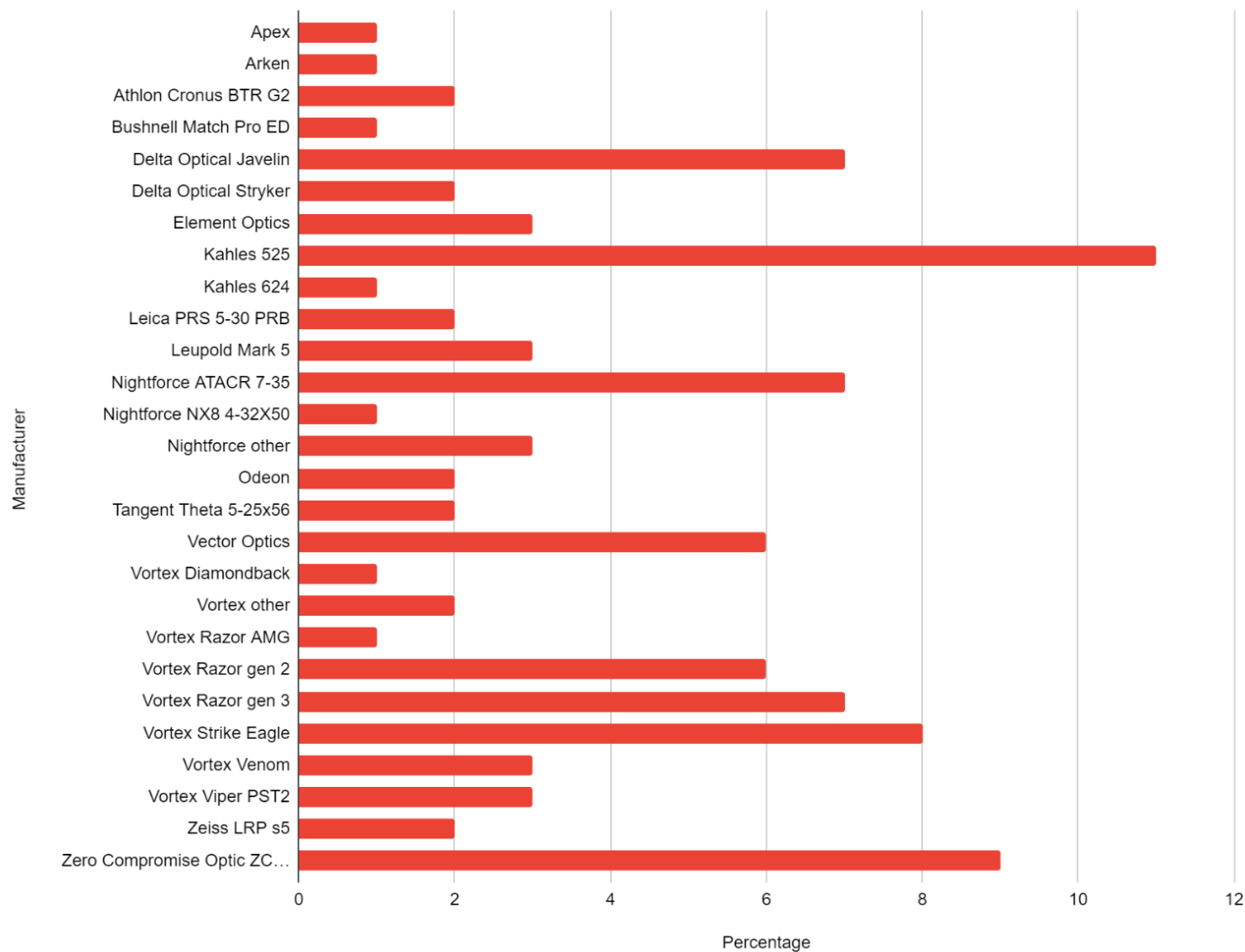
What leveling system did you use?

What rifle scope brand and model did you use?

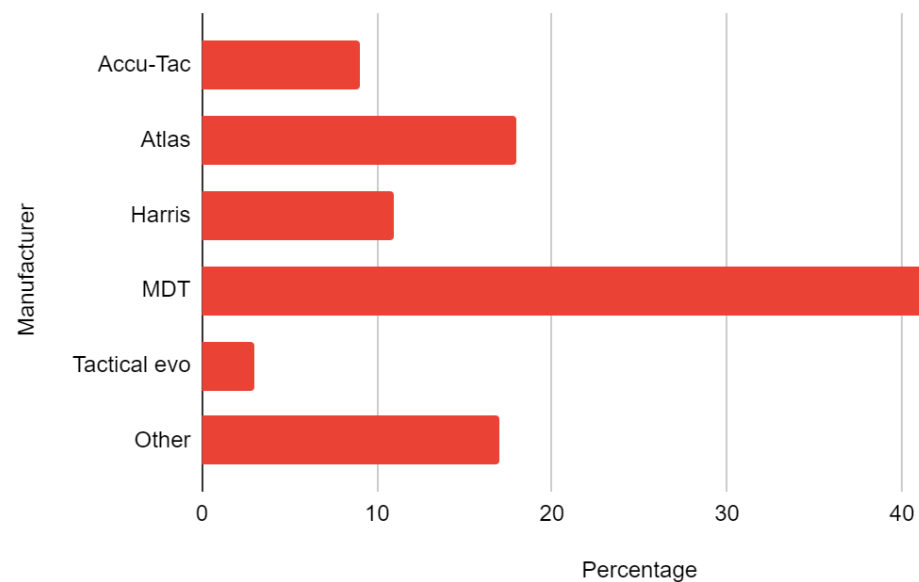

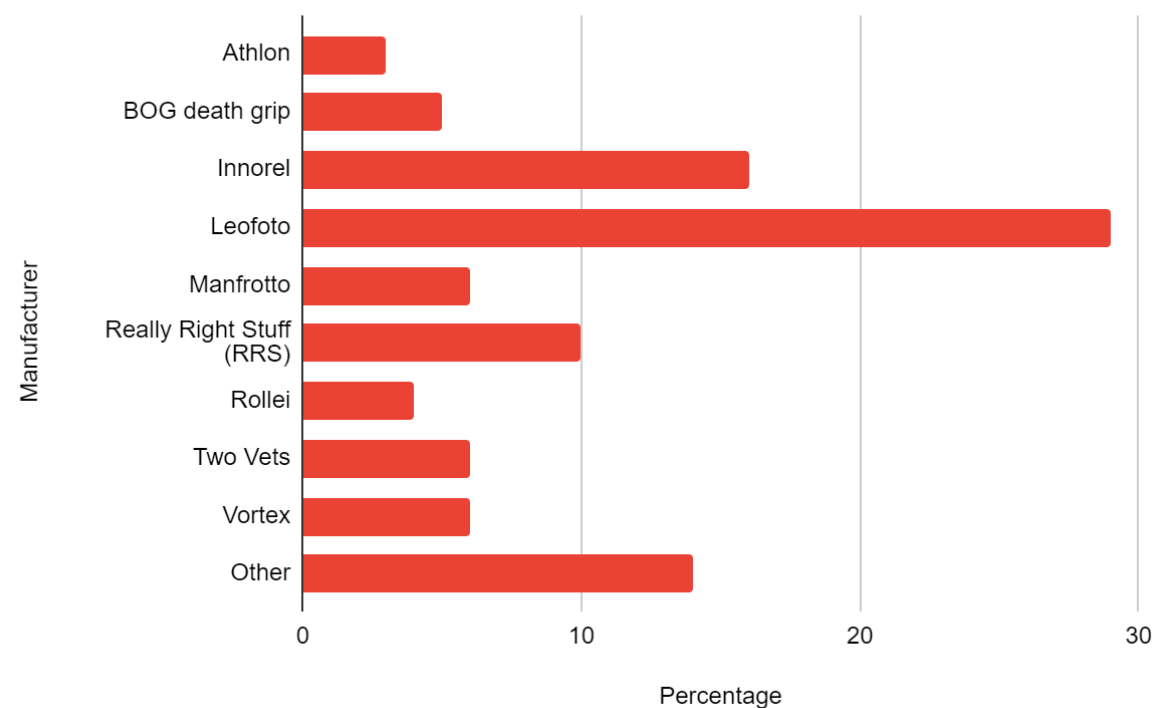

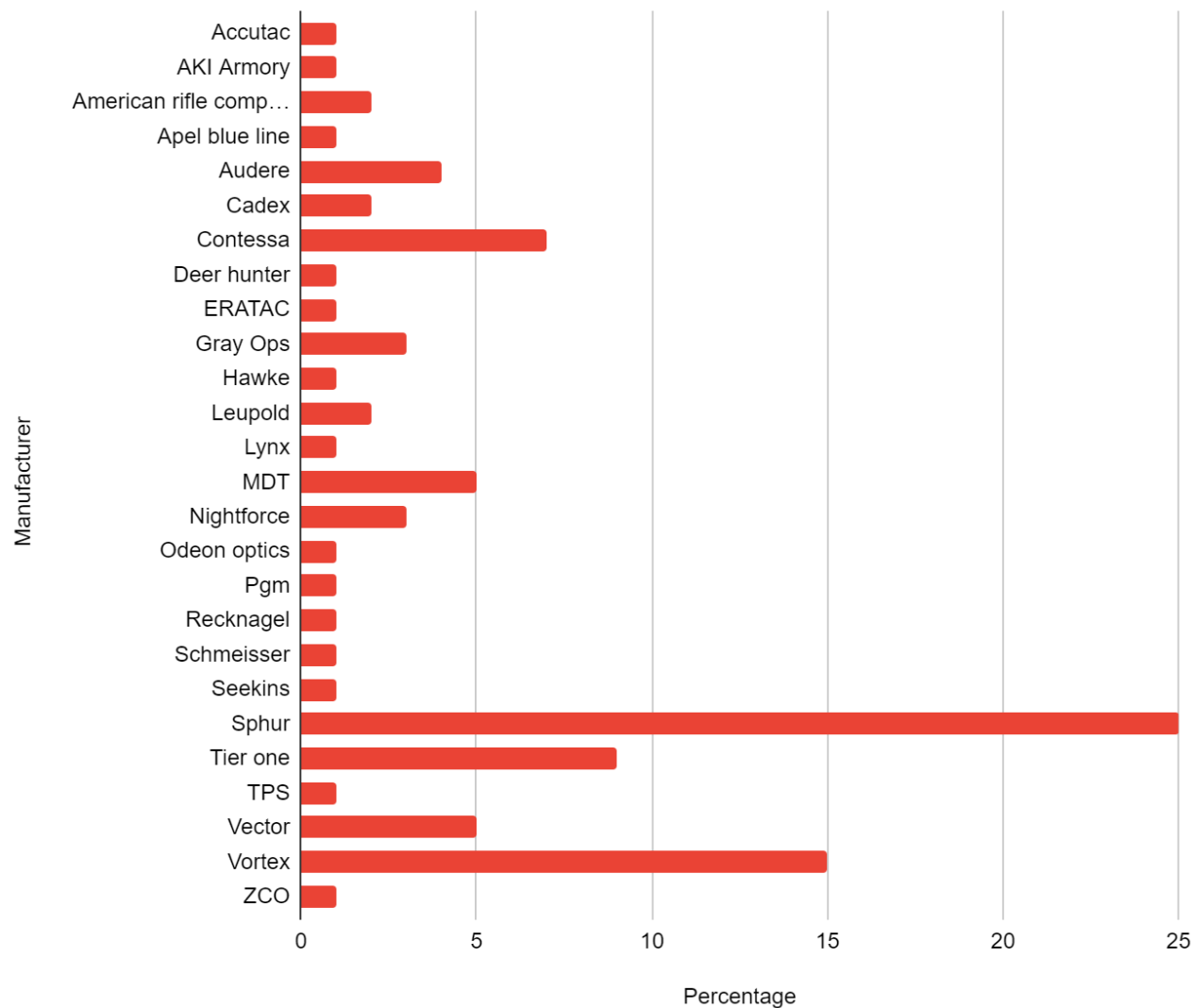
What bipod did you use?

Scope mount/rings manufacturer



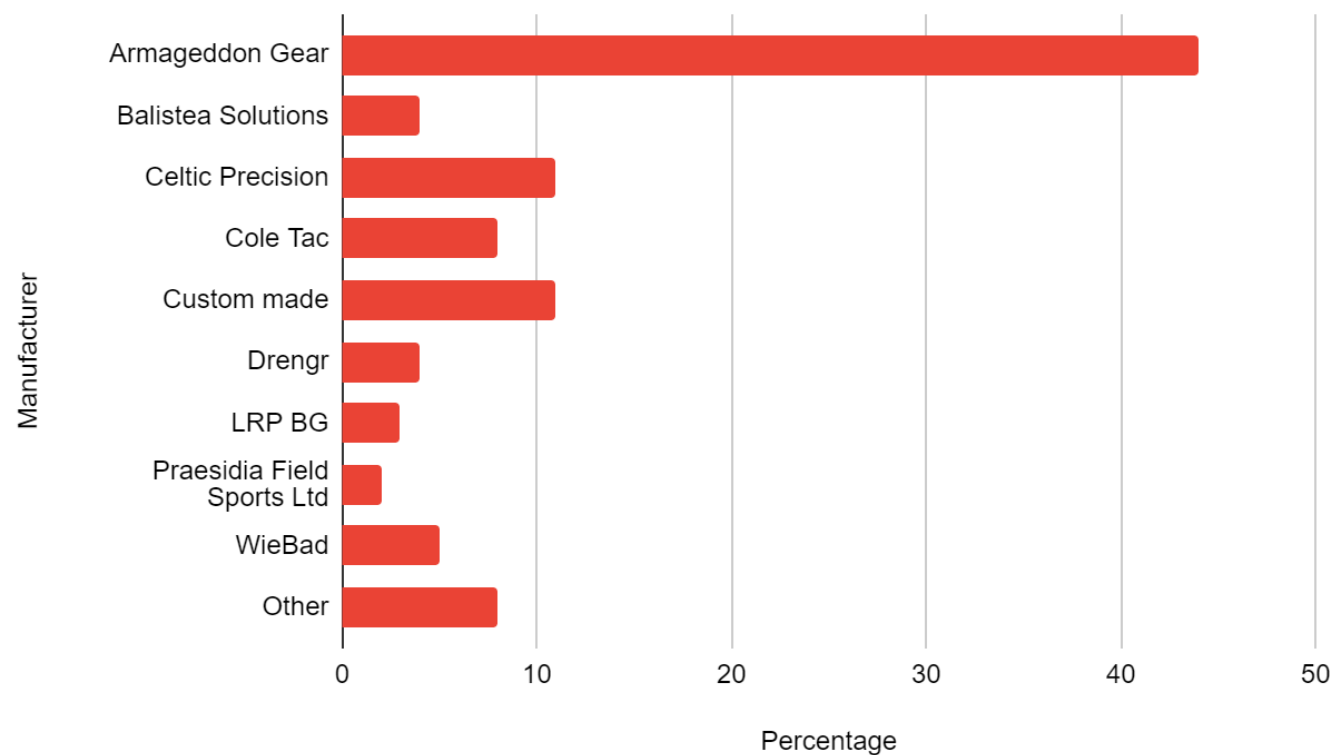
The leaders in scope mounting systems were Sphur, Vortex, and Tier One.



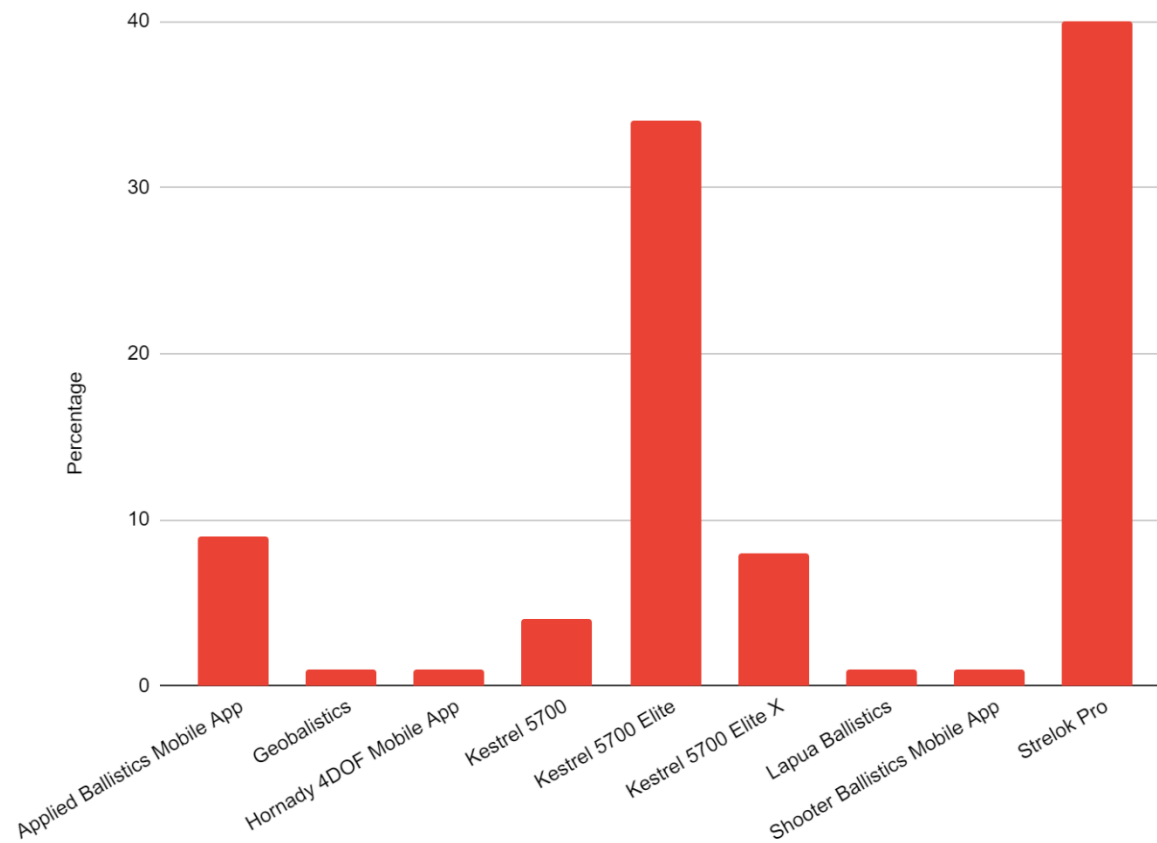

What shooting bag(s) did you use?



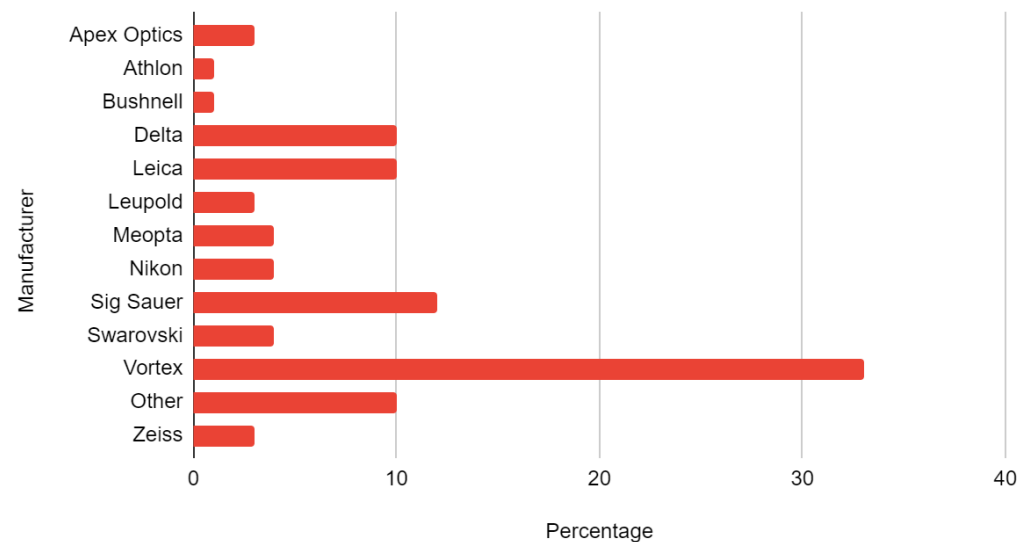
What ballistic solver did you use?



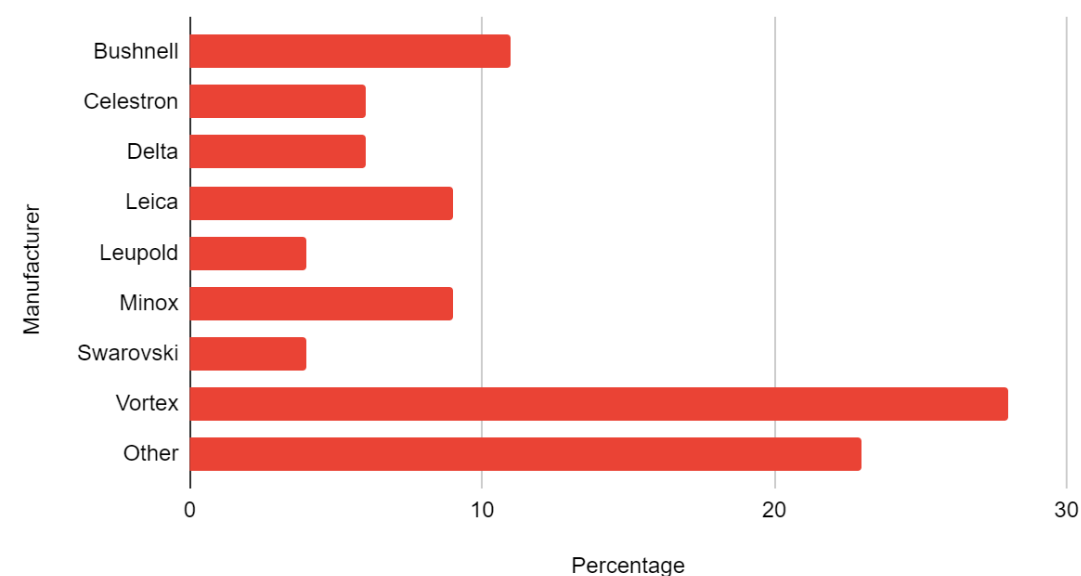
The two most popular ballistic solvers are Strelok Pro, which is an app-based calculator, and the Kestrel 5700 Elite Ballistic Calculator.

!When considering the choice of devices, not just the models, the Kestrel Ballistic Solver was the more favored option among competitors

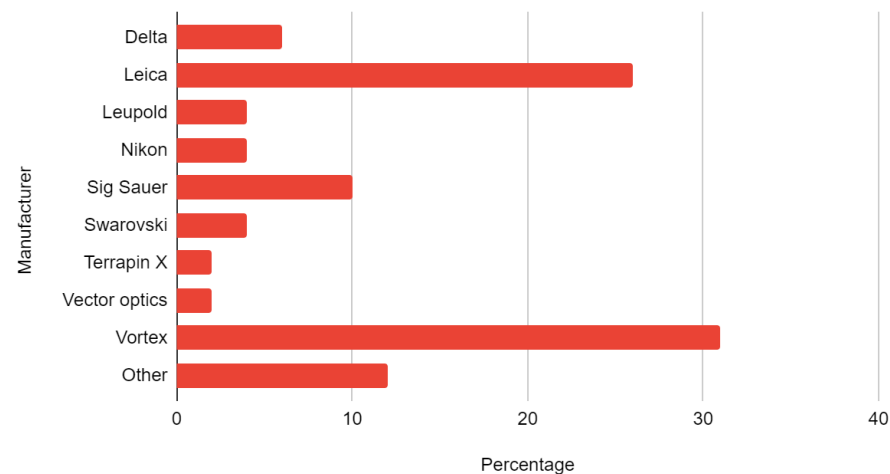
What binoculars did you use?



What spotting scope/monocular did you use?

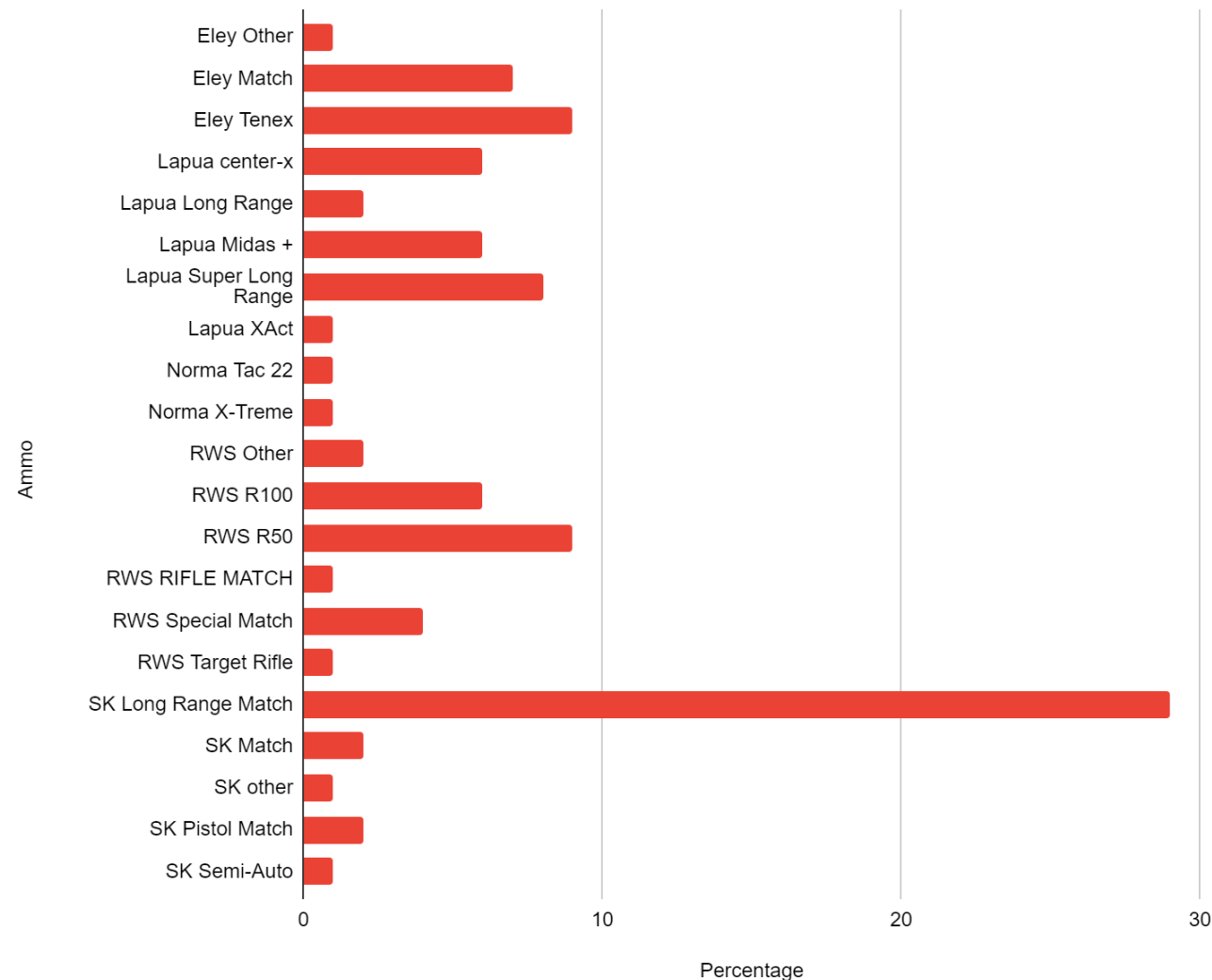


What rangefinder did you use?
